- **Being willing to do things differently and experience discomfort** seeing discomfort and tension as an opportunity to grow, not a barrier to it.

History and Context

In just the last 5 years alone, the ACLU of Oregon and our partners here today – including Oregon Justice Resource Center and Disability Rights Oregon – have filed <u>over 15 lawsuits</u> challenging police violence at protests. Even more have been filed challenging police violence beyond the protest context.

For Black communities, the police violence, bias, and response to peaceful protests challenging racist policing has persisted for generations.
